Third, the dreadful consumption of drugs of any kind legalize or not, which kill the delicate brain cells and the noblest feelings and thoughts of the human being, has left our youth lifeless. And fourth, the failure of religious leaders, who are no longer an inspiration to anyone and are no longer spiritual guides, has disappointed teens. Since the religious world can be obscured buy the evil influence among the "christians".

However, in the midst of such a gloomy picture, there is always hope. There is always hope in Jesus Christ, the living, triumphant, just, and kind Lord. Christ changes death into life, and despair into hope. He gives new life where everything has been lost. So every young person can taste the grace of God. You don't have to despair. In Christ there is life, life to spare. Just need to follow Him through out His words, listen and obey His commands then you find life, eternal life.
